NOUN (rzeczownik)
A noun is a word that names a person, place, thing or idea.
GRANDMA, FOREST, WOLF, JOY

PRONOUN (zaimek)
A pronoun is a word that takes the place of a noun or other pronouns.
WHO, ME, MOST, US, THEM, THEY, I, US

PREPOSITION (przyimek)
A preposition links nouns, pronouns and phrases within a sentence.
ABOUT, OVER, FROM, IN, DURING, BESIDE, ACROSS

VERB (czasownik)
A verb is a word that shows actions.
The action can be physical or mental.
RUN, SPEAK, DREAM, THINK

ADVERB (przysłówek)
An adverb describes a verb, adjective or another adverb.
They talked LOUDLY.
She danced BEAUTIFULLY.

CONJUNCTION (spójnik)
A conjunction links words, phrases and clauses.
AND, YET, WHILE, EITHER, BUT, FOR, BECAUSE



INFINITIVE - bezokolicznik, np. to have, to see, to stay...
IMPERATIVE - tryb rozkazujący, np. Wait! Go! Come here! Don't wait!
GERUND - imiesłów czynny, czasownik z końcówką -ing; np. smoking, skiing...
